# Learn To Return™

## Wilderness and Field Medicine

*A 2-day program that prepares field personnel for dealing with trauma and sickness in the backcountry. This program is for remote camps, field researchers, and recreationalist. Program requires completion of all hands-on activities, homework and exams.*



### Training from Experts

This 2 day program is being conducted by wilderness guides, first-aid instructors, and military trainers with extensive field experience. The program consolidates techniques that can be used in the backcountry, as well as in an urban disaster or SAR operations. Students in the program should expect full days, outdoor activities, and home work assignments. Students receive American Red Cross ratings CPR/AED, Pathogen Protection, and Wilderness First-aid in conjunction with the Learn To Return program.

### Program Focus

A primary focus of the program is the evaluation, triage, risk assessment, initial treatment of acute injuries, and then stabilization. Students practice CPR, reducing dislocations, cleaning wounds, moving patients, using pulse oximeters, and stabilizing difficult fractures. Attendees learn how to use formal medical supplies as well as how to improvise with jackets, paddles, tents and duct tape!



### Practical Simulations

Students should be prepared to be placed in “micro-scenarios” to simulate real conditions like gunshot wounds, helicopter crashes, bear attacks, and vehicle rollovers. Students will practice removing patients from aircraft, from trees and from upside down vehicles. There is an extensive use of artificial injuries and props to drive real behaviors. This course not only provides an education, but it also provides “experience”.
