# Jungle Aircrash Survival and Medicine

## Iquitos, Peru

**Curriculum Overview**  
(14 hrs classroom, 7 hrs lab, 11 hours field)

*In cooperation with Randalls Adventures and Peruvian Airforce Survival School*

This four day program is an intense look at methods and techniques for surviving aviation accidents in remote jungle locations and using wilderness medical skills to prolong survival. Students actively practice crash positions, how to release or cut their seatbelts quickly, and how to extricate people from the wreckage with an emphasis on spinal immobilization. This program is designed for formal "Rescue Teams" as well as foreign travelers over Jungle areas. Program emphasis is on reducing impact injuries and improvising care for lacerations, fractures, exposure and victim support methods specifically for adverse jungle conditions. The school will be held in Iquitos, Peru, in conjunction with Randalls Adventures and the Peruvian Airforce Jungle Survival School.



### Course Objectives

1. Be familiar with pre-positioned aircraft life-support equipment, its function and usage.
2. To identify body positions and restraint systems that minimize impact trauma.
3. To practice the steps and skills for egressing the airframe.
4. To become familiar with procedures for dealing with smoke, fire and post crash burn injuries.
5. To be familiar with the rationing and preparation of pre-packaged food and purified water sources.
6. To become familiar with aviation survival and medical kits, their contents and usage.
7. To become familiar with standard Wilderness field care protocols for prolonged care scenarios.
8. To practice methods for on-site reduction of fractures and dislocations
9. To learn improvisation techniques for splinting, bandaging, and transport of injured victims through jungle terrain.
10. To become familiar with wound cleaning and aseptic techniques in a jungle environment.
11. To learn medicinal jungle plants from the local people of the Amazon.
12. To become familiar with rescue techniques that increase an individuals chances to be located and rescued.
13. To develop team building and rescue leadership skills.
