AVIATION LAND AND WATER SURVIVAL SCHOOL

Curriculum Overview

(5 hrs classroom, 3 hrs lab, 4 hours pool, 4 hours field)

Pilots, Passengers, Fishermen.....anyone who fly's in Alaska

This two day program is an intense look at methods and techniques for surviving aviation accidents in Alaska. Students are exposed to land & water crash simulators to duplicate impact conditions. Students actively learn and practice crash positions, how to release or cut their seatbelts quickly, how to pull people from the wreckage, how to treat a variety of injuries and build survival shelters and fires. Students also receive "dunker" training in a local pool with our certified instructors. If you are a pilot or a passenger, and you fly over the Alaskan "Bush", this program will open your eyes.



Course Objectives

1. Be familiar with pre-positioned aircraft life-support equipment, its function and usage.
2. To identify body positions and restraint systems that minimize impact trauma.
3. To identify the Obstacles to escaping a surface or a submerged airframe.
4. To practice the steps and skills for egressing a surface or submerged airframe.
5. To become familiar with rescue and survival techniques that increase an individual's survival and recovery after escape from the airframe.
6. To lower the students anxiety over real emergencies by participating in a realistic simulation of land and water aviation emergencies.
7. To be familiar with the rationing and preparation of pre-packaged food sources.
8. To safely prepare and ignite pyrotechnic signaling aids in preparation for rescue.
9. To become familiar with aviation survival kits, their contents and usage.
10. To be able to select additional equipment to augment a personal Survival Kit to the individuals needs.
11. To be able to practice fire and shelter building skills in the field.
