Professional Bear Guard

Wildlife Injury Prevention and Worker Protection Program taught to OSHA 1926.21 (b) (4) and ANSI/ASSE Z490.1-2016



Program Information

The 24 hour HSE curriculum is a consolidation of standardized modules that deal with the responsibilities of guiding, maintaining, and protecting field crews during remote operations. While the program instructs the use of firearms for defense, the major emphasis of the program is protecting humans from wildlife in a manner that results in doing no harm to the wildlife encountered. Guard responsibilities include strategies for navigating difficult terrain, thick vegetation, moving water, dealing with injuries and maintaining radio communication..

Bear Guard Training

Understanding the roles and responsibilities of being a Safety Professional is paramount to effectively guard clients. Training begins with HSE protocols and requirements of the Alaska Dept. of Fish and Game and the US Fish and Wildlife Service. Students are instructed in animal behavior, risk assessment, and protective methods, to include: the use of bear spray, sound devices, electric fences, firearm deterrent cartridges, and lethal force. Lethal force training includes shotguns, rifles and handguns. The schedule includes two firearm qualification sessions where safety, decision making, tactical shooting, and accuracy are formally evaluated.



Field Training hool also incorporates land

The LTR Guard School also incorporates land navigation training, GPS and Radio usage and aviation safety training in small aircraft survival. Training culminates with a field exercise where students play the part of a guard, guiding workers through field exercises. All equipment, firearms, ammunition and testing materials are provided. Students will receive homework assignments as well as a requirement of completion of a formal written exam.
