Student Requirements

- **Prior basic handgun experience is required**
- The firearm and holster system you plan to carry for predator defense*
- 100 rounds of ammunition for that firearm

Classroom Training

The classroom portion starts with a close look at wildlife biology, behavior, body language, and how to possibly determine the risk of attack. Students determine their reaction to a wildlife encounter based on distance and aggression. The program includes discussions on the effectiveness of handguns as a deterrent, their integration into a defensive strategy combined with bear spray, and defensive positioning.



Program Overview

This eight hour program focuses on situational awareness and conflict avoidance when dealing with potentially aggressive wildlife. We then cover those threats which require active deterrence, or lethal force with a handgun. Before going to the range, students practice protective posturing, rapid deployment of a handgun from a holster, and loading/unloading procedures. The afternoon session is spent at a local range using LTR specially designed targets, a moving target and even simulated foliage and terrain.



Range Training

Range training starts with a detailed range safety and procedure briefing in preparation for live fire drills. Students will fire 80-100 rounds of ammunition at varying ranges on realistic targets. During the firearms drills, students are coached so they can improve their shooting proficiency with both stationary and moving targets. LTR Instructors challenge the shooters by adding weighted packs, weather and terrain conditions and reducing shooting time.
