Wilderness / Delayed Transport Field Medicine

A two day program that prepares field personnel for dealing with trauma and sickness in remote work locations where help is significantly delayed.

Program Overview



16 hours of hands-on medical training preparing workers to care for injuries needing prolonged management. Focus is on understanding the problems of remote medical care and applying recognized medical techniques that have been adapted for wilderness accidents or remote work locations. Students are tested through scenarios, quizzes, and homework assignments. The program emphasis is on the use of pulses, respiratory rates, and levels of consciousness to direct treatment. This information is then transmitted to EMS.

Training Sessions

Hands-on educational sessions encourage leadership and communication, requiring students to make rapid decisions. Students practice moving patients on to pads, cleaning wounds, reducing dislocations, and stabilizing difficult fractures. Attendees will apply tourniquets, document injuries, practice CPR and AED usage based on wilderness medical protocols.



Practical Simulations

Students should be prepared to be placed in "microscenarios" to simulate real conditions like gunshot wounds, helicopter crashes, bear attacks, and vehicle rollovers. Students will practice removing patients from aircraft, from trees and from upside down vehicles. There is an extensive use of artificial injuries and props to drive real behaviors. This course not only provides an education, but it also provides "experience" and medical direction.
